Facilities and Hire	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hiring of school facilities continues. Group numbers must not exceed 100 people (including staff, trainers and spectators) per indoor or outdoor space, or one person per 4 square metres, whichever is lesser.</li> <li>Communal facilities can open. Please refer to the CECG Return to Sport Guide Appendix A and 4. Community-based Sporting Activities 4.1 and 4.2. A risk assessment for this should be outlined in the COVID Safety Plan in addition to the continued use of the CECG PE/Sporting Activity Checklist.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hiring of school facilities continues. In the ACT, group numbers must not exceed 500 people (including staff, trainers and spectators), one person per 4 square metres indoors, or one person per 2 square metres outdoors, whichever is lesser.</li> <li>Communal facilities such as change rooms can open and require a COVID Safety Plan.</li> </ul>	
On-Site Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Schools should limit the number of adult visitors/volunteers on school sites.</li> <li>Parents should avoid routinely entering the school building where possible but can attend scheduled school events and meetings with teachers. Physical distancing and hygiene measures still apply.</li> <li>Records should be kept of visitors attending the school including any volunteer coaches. Their attendance is to be recorded on the CECG PE/Sporting Activities Checklist.</li> <li>In regards to any Incident Response and Record Keeping please refer to the CECG Return to Sport Guide 5. Incident Response and Record Keeping 5.1 and 5.2.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Schools should limit the number of adult visitors/volunteers on school sites.</li> <li>Parents should avoid routinely entering the school building where possible but can attend scheduled school events and meetings with teachers – gathering restrictions (500 adults-ACT), physical distancing and hygiene measures still apply.</li> <li>Records should be kept of visitors attending the school including any volunteer coaches. Their attendance is to be recorded on the CECG PE/Sporting Activities Checklist.</li> <li>In regards to any Incident Response and Record Keeping please refer to the CECG Return to Sport Guide 5. Incident Response and Record Keeping 5.1 and 5.2.</li> <li>In the ACT, Parent-teacher interviews can resume in a face-to-face format, with a maximum of 500 people (excluding students and staff) or one person per four metres squared for indoor events, which ever is lesser.</li> </ul>	
Excursions and out of School Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Overnight excursions must not occur.</li> <li>Day only excursions can continue within the region. Groups must not exceed 100 people (this number includes adults).</li> <li>Excursions at cultural and arts institutions and heritage sites must be organised to ensure tour groups of 20 people only (not including tour guide).</li> <li>A COVID-19 risk assessment should be undertaken for all excursions.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Excursions, including interschool sports, can continue within the region. In the ACT, groups must not exceed 500 people (this number includes adults). Schools should review the excursion provider's COVID-19 safety plan prior to conducting the excursion.</li> <li>Local and low risk interstate excursions and camps can resume (with some restrictions) where they are a necessary part of a student's education program (for example, College outdoor education programs). This includes overnight excursions/camps to country and remote areas (metropolitan only by exception) where mixing with other people is minimised with physical distancing restrictions for adults. Camping should be in single tents where possible.</li> <li>Schools must adhere to the specific COVID-19 rules within the state or territory they are travelling in and complete a COVID-19 safety plan.</li> </ul>	
Assemblies, Performances and End-of-Year Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Small assemblies, gatherings and performances can resume with limitations on parent/carer audience numbers (maximum of 100 adults, 1 adult per 4m<sup>2</sup>, each (family) group must sit 1.5 metres apart).</li> <li>Sacramental programs and masses should be in small class/year groups only, following social distancing requirements of &lt;100 people.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the ACT, assemblies, gatherings and performances can resume with a maximum of 500 people (excluding students and staff) or one person per four square metres squared for indoor events and one person per two metres squared for outdoor events, which ever is lesser.</li> <li>In NSW, whole of school assemblies can recommence from 12 November. Where possible, students should remain within their relevant cohort to limit the mixing of students between cohort groups. Parents and carers are not permitted to attend school assemblies.</li> </ul>	
P&F / Community Council	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>On-site, student only fundraisers can go ahead.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Working bees can go ahead within health guidelines.</li> <li>School Community Council meetings can be conducted at the School noting there is a limitation in NSW of 20 persons (not include staff).</li> <li>In ACT Fundraising events can go ahead with a maximum of 500 people (excluding students and staff) or one person per four square metres squared for indoor events and one person per two metres squared for outdoor events, which ever is lesser.</li> <li>In NSW School Community Council or other community social events or functions, fetes and barbecues are not permitted.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>School fetes can go ahead in line with broader community restrictions.</li> </ul>
Cleaning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Out of hours cleaning continues with a focus on high frequency touch points, including daily cleaning of student desks.</li> <li>Day cleaning continues with a focus on high frequency touch points including: school entry/administration areas, staff rooms and kitchens, washrooms and major transit areas.</li> <li>Sufficient soap, paper towel and hand sanitiser supplied to every school.</li> </ul>
